The European Fair Play Movement (EFPM) is a European non-governmental organisation, established in 1994 in the FIFA House in Zurich. National Fair Play organisations from 40 European Countries have been a part the EFPM since 1994. The main goal of the EFPM is to promote Fair Play and Tolerance in sports and everyday life at the European level. The EFPM seeks to achieve this goal by supporting its members, by helping to promote Fair Play campaigns where sports organisations take the initiative, by co-operating with the authorities to foster Fair Play themes and by facilitating regular contacts between the various European sports organisations.

The goal of EFPM Flash News is to keep people informed on EFPM's activities and to establish closer contact not only with all the EFPM members but also with all European governmental and non-governmental sport institutions and organisations aiming to support and to contribute to the promotion of Ethics in Sport and encouragement of the Fair Play values and principles in all sporting activities as well as in daily life.

The Executive Committee of the European Fair Play Movement held its 59th meeting on 2-4 March 2018 in Vienna at the invitation of ASKÖ. The program included President Christian Hinterberger's report, Secretary General I. Psilopoulos' information on current topics and Treasurer Katarina Raczova's presentation of EFPM's financial situation. Moreover, members of the Executive Committee provided information about their active participation at different European events related to the achievement of the EFPM goals during the last period.

The Executive Committee raised attention to the evaluation of the 23rd EFP Congress with the aim to elevate the level of future events. Furthermore, one key topic of the meeting was the next European Fair Play Congress which will be held in Brussels (BEL) in November 2018. The general topic will be "Sports. Spirit. Humanity.". The event will be organized by the Belgium EFPM member, Panathlon Wallonie-Brussels, today regarded as the "armed wing" of the Belgian Olympic movement for all matters linked to sporting ethics and the promotion of the positive values spread by Sport. Philippe Housiaux, President of this very active institution, introduced some ideas and perspectives related to this event. He also drew the attention of the participants to the Declaration initiated by Panathlon Wallonie-Brussels, signed by all important organisations in Belgium.

The EFPM scientific advisory committee under the leadeship of Steve Town, evaluated the EFP Congress in Haifa in order to assess its effectiveness and made recommendations for future improvement. The document was presented by Romana Caput-Jagunica at the EFPM ExCom meeting in Vienna and discussed in details. Specific recommendations of the EFPM scientific advisory

- Have a better system for the dissemination of best practice from the congress on an ongoing

basis

- Have even more interactive sessions
- Consider a stronger congress focus on fair play on the pitch, in the game.

In this respect, EFPM annually invites all its members, European National Olympic Committees, sports organizations and educational institutions to submit their applications to the Fair Play Awards in following categories:

-The European Fair Play Plaque of Merit and Diploma, under the auspices of the European Olympic Committees;

- The European Fair Play Diploma, under the auspices of the European Olympic Committees;
- The EFPM "Spirit of Fair Play" Award;
- The EFPM "Fair Play Flame" Award (to an athlete, or a team Under 18);
- The EFPM "Fair Play Vox" Award, under the auspices of AIPS Europe.

The Portuguese National Olympic Committee awarded Prof. Dr. Carlos Gonçalves, founding member of the European Fair Play Movement, who served as Vice-President for seven years and as President for eleven years (2001-2012) with the National Award of Ethics in Sports, which is Portugal's most important sports award. For more than 50 years, Carlos Gonçalves has embodied fair play education in Europe and has dedicated his time, passion and energy for the spreading of fair play and tolerance. Jose Costantino, President of the Portuguese National Olympic Committee, and the 2nd President Rosa Motta, the famous Olympic Marathon Champion, were present at the ceremony. On behalf of the fair play family we express our compliments to Carlos Gonçalves.

Every year since 2007, the Fair Play Commission of the National Olympic Committee of Azerbaijan (AzFPC), under the leadership of its President Khazar Isayev, traditionally holds different events to draw the attention of the sports community to this field and to promote the principles of fair play and encourage those committed to these principles. On 30 January 2018, the fair play delegation of the Croatian Olympic Committee visited the Slovenian Olympic Academy. The delegation was led by Danira Bilić, president of the Fair Play Committee, Biserka Vrbek, member of the Executive Committee and of the European Fair Play Movement, and Saša Ceraj, head of the Croatian Olympic Academy.

Miroslav Cerar welcomed the delegation at the headquarters of the Slovenian Olympic Committee, also present were Slovenian Olympic Academy members: Aleš Šolar, Sonja Poljšak and Petra Robnik.

The aim of the visit was for the delegates to view the Slovenian Education Centre and become acquainted with the activities and projects of the Slovenian Olympic Academy.

After Cerar's introductory address, Aleš Šolar presented the function of the Slovenian Olympic Academy and its most important projects.

The guests were extremely impressed by the work carried out by

the Slovenian Olympic Academy and the Education Centre. They expressed the wish to continue the successful collaboration in the future.

On 3 February 2018, the World Cup tournament of Junior Fencers took place in Bratislava, welcoming 188 female juniors from 30 countries. The Fair Play Club of the SOC was also present at this significant event as long-standing partner of the Slovak Fencing Federation in order to spread the principles of humanity and fairness. One of the manifestations of this cooperation is the use of Fair Play cards at fencing events and the subsequent announcement of Fair Play Awards based on such useage. At this event, the Fair Play card could be granted not only to a sportswoman behaving honestly in critical situations during the sports competition, but also to trainers, parents, coaches or fans. In this spirit, the plaque of the Fair Play Club of the Slovak Olympic Committee was awarded to

the Hungarian fencer Nelli Ladányi from the Sports Centre Szolnok, who corrected the verdict of the referee in an important close match to her disadvantage. After the end of combats, the referees could hold on to the memories of a well-organised event and also to Fair Play cards, specifically made for this event, which they can contribute to spreading the initiative of the Fair Play Club and the Slovak Fencing Federation in their countries with. The award handed over by Katarina Raczova of the Fair Play Club of SOC to Attila Prastron, Nelli Ladányi's coach on her behalf.





The San Marino Fair Play Committee (CNSFP) became member of the EFPM at the General Assembly in Haifa, in October 2017. One of their most important projects is a review of Fair Play in 2017, published just some days ago. It provides a helpful and well-researched overview of happenings connected to the world of Fair Play and initiatives conducted by CNSFP in the last year in sports and beyond. Including also dozens of press articles, the review demonstrates that the world of Fair Play is well alive, being a source of motivation and inspiration, which we need to continue for it to be. For example, the publication informs on 17 years old Ariana Luterman, who at the marathon in Dallas in December 2017 selflessly helped the winner Chandler Self over the finishing one, who

had constantly been suffering from exhaustion. Or, the document informs on Pietro Collini from Cailungo, who in the Sammarinese Football Championships rather kicked the ball out of play than scoring, having spotted the opponent's defender having remained on ground after a clash with Pietro's team mate.



The Academic College at Wingate and the Olympic Committee of Israel are proud to host the 5th Wingate Congress of Exercise and Sport Sciences scheduled to take place on 7-10 June 2018 at the Academic College at Wingate, Israel.
