The European Fair Play Movement (EFPM) is a European non-governmental organisation, established in 1994 in the FIFA House in Zurich. National Fair Play organisations from 40 European Countries have been a part the EFPM since 1994. The main goal of the EFPM is to promote Fair Play and Tolerance in sports and everyday life at the European level. The EFPM seeks to achieve this goal by supporting its members, by helping to promote Fair Play campaigns where sports organisations take the initiative, by co-operating with the authorities to foster Fair Play themes and by facilitating regular contacts between the various European sports organisations.

The goal of EFPM Flash News is to keep people informed on EFPM's activities and to establish closer contact not only with all the EFPM members but also with all European governmental and non-governmental sport institutions and organisations aiming to support and to contribute to the promotion of Ethics in Sport and encouragement of the Fair Play values and principles in all sporting activities as well as in daily life.

## We are delighted to inform you of some outstanding acts of Fair Play that took place recently:

<u>The Afghanistan Football Federation won the 2013 FIFA Fair Play award</u> at the FIFA Ballon d'Or awards ceremony, which took place on January 13, 2014, in Zurich. They received this award after hosting their first international match in August 2013, after a long break of 10 years. The friendly against Pakistan was promoted as a symbol of football's ability to foster peace and unite countries in a shared love of sport.

The Afghanistan Football Federation which has continued to promote sport in a country ravaged by war won the award given to "persons or institutions for their fair play, an issue that has always been of crucial significance to world football's governing body". It is a great and crucial way of trying to reunite the Afghan people through football, which was honored by FIFA.

The Fair Play spirit has permanently been present at the Olympic Games in Sochi 2014 - following extraordinary stories are a living proof:

When Russia's Anton Gafarov crashed and broke a ski during a semifinal heat in the men's crosscountry sprint, Justin Wadsworth, head coach of the rivaling Canadian cross-country team, jumped in to help. The Canadian coach ran onto the slope, spare ski in hand, and quickly fastened it to Gafarov's boot, drawing a cheer from the crowd. Thanks to Justin Wadsworth's action Anton Gafarov was able to finish the race in front of home fans. "I just couldn't let him sit there", Justin Wadsworth explained his decision to support the Russian athlete.

In similar fashion the Russian cross-country ski team came to the assistance of their German rivals after finding out that Germany's drilling machines were broken. Without hesitation and ignoring all rivalry the Russian team granted access to their own drilling machine allowing the Germans to prepare their skis. Without this generous act in the spirit of Fair Play it wouldn't have been possible for the German cross-country skiing athletes to compete at the Olympic Games.
