The European Fair Play Movement (EFPM) is a European non-governmental organisation, established in 1994 in the FIFA House in Zurich. National Fair Play organisations from 40 European Countries have been a part the EFPM since 1994. The main goal of the EFPM is to promote Fair Play and Tolerance in sports and everyday life at the European level. The EFPM seeks to achieve this goal by supporting its members, by helping to promote Fair Play campaigns where sports organisations take the initiative, by co-operating with the authorities to foster Fair Play themes and by facilitating regular contacts between the various European sports organisations.

The goal of EFPM Flash News is to keep people informed on EFPM's activities and to establish closer contact not only with all the EFPM members but also with all European governmental and non-governmental sport institutions and organisations aiming to support and to contribute to the promotion of Ethics in Sport and encouragement of the Fair Play values and principles in all sporting activities as well as in daily life.

Jiří Pelikán has passed away at the age of 82. He was a member of the Czech Olympic Committee, since 1987 a member of the board of the Czech Fair Play Club and was its president in 1995-2006. In the 1990s he was one of the initiators of the founding of the European Fair Play Movement.

Jiří Pelikán was also active in athletics - at TJ Sokol Vinohrady, then Slavie Brandýs nad Labem and Slavoj Stará Boleslav. During 1964-1979 he was member of the section committee and head of referees,

from 1988 he was chairman of the Central Bohemian Czech Athletics Association, later the Regional Athletics Association, in 1990-1992 he was member of the Executive Committee of the Czech Athletics Association and chairman of the Committee for Development Policy in Athletics. He became referee in 1954 and later a central official and instructor of referees. In 2009 he was conferred the title Honorary member of the Czech Athletics Association. Our thoughts are with his family and friends. May he rest in peace.

On 12 March 2015 the formal announcement of the results of the 48<sup>th</sup> Fair Play Club of the Polish Olympic Committee (POC) contest took part at the Olympic Centre in Warsaw, POL. Andrzej Biernat, Minister of Sports and Tourism, reminded everybody in his speech about the great social importance of Fair Play's values and athletes obeying them.

POC-President Andrzej Kraśnicki and Prof. Halina Zdebska-Biziewska, who has chaired the Club for two years, emphasized the importance of Fair Play Club Awards and their laureates in the wide spectrum of NOC-activities.

The main trophy went to tennis player Łukasz Kubot. During his quarter final match in doubles (with Robert Lindstedtem from Sweden) at the Australian Open he asked the referee to change a verdict initially to the benefit of Ł. Kubot and R. Lindstedtem. "It was an important moment of our match", Łukasz Kubot said afterwards,

Birgitta Kervinen was awarded for her remarkable lifetime work in the spirit of the Olympic Ideals and especially the values of Fair Play.

**EFPM "Fair Play Flame" Award** goes to: *Patrik Spesny (CZE), Ice-Hockey Youngster* 

Patrik Spesny refused to participate in an act of betting during a match in the Junior Extra-League against HC Motor Česke Budějovice. A player from the opponent team suggested via SMS that Patrik should bet on the result of the match and then through his deliberately poor performance arrange a defeat of his team HC Litvinov – for which he was to be "rewarded" financially.

The Diplomas in the "Act of Fair Play" category went to young tennis player Marta Bogucka, motorcycle rider Jakub Przygoński and mountain climbers Grzegorz Bielejec, Marek Chmielarski and Mariusz Grudzień.

Traditionally the Fair Play Club awards outstanding personalities for "all their sports career and worthy life after the end of sports career". This year the honorable mention went to Halina Aszkiełowicz-Wojno (bronze medal winner in volleyball at the Olympic Games in Mexico), Wiesław Rudkowski (silver medal winner in boxing in Munich) and Sobiesław Zasada (the legend of Polish automobile sport, multiple European champion and winner of more than 150 races).

The Diplomas for Fair Play Value Promotion in Sport and Life were awarded to Zbigniew Cendrowski (many years school sport official), priest Mirosław Mikulski (pastor of Polish athletes, organizer of sport events for children and youth), Tadeusz Olszański (journalist, writer and translator, initiator of the "Gentleman of Sport" contest, co-founder of the Fair Play Club and Polish Olympic Academy) and Zbigniew Kulik, who received the diploma on behalf of the Museum of Sports and Tourism in Karpacz, which has contributed to the promotion of sport and Olympic idea for years.



The European Non-Governmental Sports Organisation (ENSGO) held its 23<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly in Lisbon, 29-30 April 2015. The event was attended by representatives of National Sport Confederations and National Olympic Committees from 21 countries. On the same occasion, the ENGSO Youth General Assembly, an ENGSO EU Seminar and a Sport for All session were also organised.

The EFPM was represented at this event by its former President Carlos Gonçalves.

Amongst other procedures the ENGSO General Assembly elected Carlos Cardoso (POR) as the new ENGSO-President and Ian Holze (GER) as new Vice-President.

Paolo Adami (ITA) was elected as new ENGSO Youth President. The EFPM longs for the organisation of a European Youth Fair Play Congress in parallel with the organisation of the EFP Congress in a near future.

During the event the participants were hosted by the Lisbon Municipality and took part at a sunset closing dinner held in a sailing boat along the Tagus River.

To both newly elected Presidents the EFPM expresses its congratulations and best wishes of a deep and fruitful cooperation.

Kamuti, President of the Hungarian and International Fair Play Committee, underlined the significance of the event, as the Hungarian Fair Play Committee was founded fifty years ago, in 1965, on the initiative of Hungarian sport journalists.

The Hungarian Fair Play Committee honored 19 personalities of sport and culture for promoting the ideas of Fair Play and the spirit of Fair Play in culture and sport for lifelong achievement as well as for acts of Fair Play. At the end of the event, Katarina Raczova honored the Hungarian Fair Play Committee for its outstanding work and handed over a present to its President, Jenö Kamuti, on behalf of EFPM as a sign of appreciation.

"At the next CSIT Games in Riga in 2017 the Green Card will be visualized", H. Bouchoms said.
